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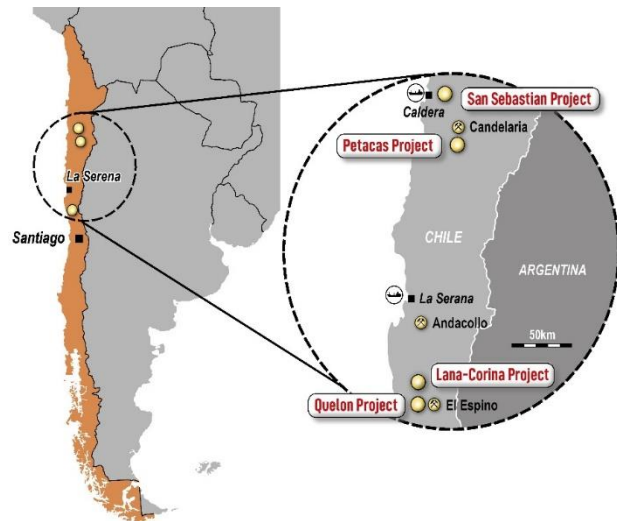
ABOUT CULPEO MINERALS LIMITED

Culpeo Minerals is a copper exploration and development company with assets in Chile, the world's number one copper producer. The Company is exploring and developing high grade copper systems in the coastal Cordillera region of Chile.

The Company has recently acquired the Lana Corina Project situated in the Coquimbo region of Chile, where near surface breccia hosted high-grade copper mineralisation offers walk up drilling targets and early resource definition potential.

The Company has two additional assets, the Las Petacas Project, located in the Atacama Fault System near the world-class Candelaria Mine. Historic exploration has identified significant surface mineralisation with numerous outcrops of high-grade copper mineralisation which provide multiple compelling exploration targets. The Quelon Project located 240km north of Santiago and 20km north of the regional centre of Illapel, in the Province of Illapel, Region of Coquimbo. Historical artisanal mining has taken place within the Quelon Project area, but modern exploration in the project area is limited to rock chip sampling and geophysical surveys.

Culpeo Minerals has a strong board and management team with significant Chilean country expertise and has an excellent in-country network. All these elements enable the company to gain access to quality assets in a non-competitive environment. 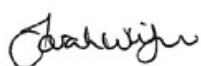

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT

This Explanatory Statement has been prepared to provide information which the Directors believe to be material to Shareholders in deciding whether or not to pass the Resolutions.

1. FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AND REPORTS – PERIOD ENDED 30 JUNE 2022

The first item of the Notice deals with the consolidated annual financial report of the Company for the financial period ended 30 June 2022 together with the Directors' declaration, the Remuneration Report, the Directors' report and the auditor's report. Shareholders should consider these documents and raise any matters of interest with the Directors when this item is being considered.

No resolution is required to be moved in respect of this item.

Shareholders will be given a reasonable opportunity at the Annual General Meeting to ask questions and make comments on the accounts and on the business, operations and management of the Company.

The Chairman will also provide Shareholders a reasonable opportunity to ask the auditor questions relevant to:

- (a) the conduct of the audit;
- (b) the preparation and content of the independent audit report;
- (c) the accounting policies adopted by the Company in relation to the preparation of accounts; and
- (d) the independence of the auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit.

The Company will not provide a hard copy of the Company's annual financial report to Shareholders unless specifically requested to do so. The Company's annual financial report is available on its website at <https://www.culpeominerals.com.au/>.

2. RESOLUTION 1 – ADOPTION OF REMUNERATION REPORT

2.1 General

The Corporations Act requires that at a listed company's annual general meeting, a resolution that the remuneration report be adopted must be put to the shareholders. However, such a resolution is advisory only and does not bind the company or the directors of the company.

The remuneration report sets out the company's remuneration arrangements for the directors and senior management of the company. The remuneration report is part of the directors' report contained in the annual financial report of the company for a financial year.

The chair of the meeting must allow a reasonable opportunity for its shareholders to ask questions about or make comments on the remuneration report at the annual general meeting.

2.2 Voting consequences

A company is required to put to its shareholders a resolution proposing the calling of another meeting of shareholders to consider the appointment of directors of the company (**Spill Resolution**) if, at consecutive annual general meetings, at least 25%

of the votes cast on a remuneration report resolution are voted against adoption of the remuneration report and at the first of those annual general meetings a Spill Resolution was not put to vote. If required, the Spill Resolution must be put to vote at the second of those annual general meetings.

If more than 50% of votes cast are in favour of the Spill Resolution, the company must convene a shareholder meeting (**Spill Meeting**) within 90 days of the second annual general meeting.

All of the directors of the company who were in office when the directors' report (as included in the company's annual financial report for the most recent financial year) was approved, other than the managing director of the company, will cease to hold office immediately before the end of the Spill Meeting but may stand for re-election at the Spill Meeting.

Following the Spill Meeting those persons whose election or re-election as directors of the company is approved will be the directors of the company.

2.2 Previous voting results

At the Company's previous annual general meeting the votes cast against the remuneration report considered at that annual general meeting were less than 25%. Accordingly, the Spill Resolution is not relevant for this Annual General Meeting.

3. RESOLUTION 2 – RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTOR – MR GEOFFREY MCNAMARA

3.1 General

Clause 14.2 of the Company's Constitution states that at the Company's annual general meeting, one-third of the Directors for the time being, or, if their number is not a multiple of 3, then the number nearest one-third (rounded upwards in case of doubt), shall retire from office, provided always that no Director except a managing director shall hold office for a period in excess of 3 years, or until the third annual general meeting following his or her appointment, whichever is the longer, without submitting himself for re-election. The Directors to retire at an annual general meeting are those who have been longest in office since their last election, but, as between persons who became Directors on the same day, those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by drawing lots.

Listing Rule 14.4 provides that, other than a managing director, a director of an entity must not hold office (without re-election) past the third annual general meeting following the director's appointment or 3 years, whichever is the longer.

In accordance with the Constitution and Listing Rule 14.4, Mr Geoffrey McNamara, who was last elected by Shareholders on 22 February 2021 and having been in office the longest since elected, retires by rotation, and seeks re-election.

3.2 Qualifications and other material directorships - Mr Geoffrey McNamara

Mr McNamara is a geologist with over 30 years' of international resource sector experience as a geologist, project manager and fund manager. Previously he worked in Private Equity (FUM USD800 million) and as a Director of Societe General's Mining Finance Team in New York. Operational roles include Project Manager, Senior Mine Geologist and Mine Geologist for Ivanhoe Mines, Lion Ore International and Western Mining Corporation.

Mr McNamara holds a Bachelors degree in Geology, a Graduate Diploma in Applied Finance and Investment from the Financial Services Institute of Australasia

(FINSIA). He is a member of the Australian Institute of Company Directors (AICD) and the Australasian Institute of Mining and Metallurgy (AusIMM).

3.3 Independence

If re-elected the Board does not consider Mr McNamara to be an independent Director due to his substantial shareholding in the Company.

3.4 Other material information

The Company conducts appropriate checks on the background and experience of candidates before their appointment to the Board. The Company undertook such checks prior to lodging its initial public offer prospectus with ASIC and applying for admission to the official list of the ASX.

Mr McNamara has confirmed that he considers he will have sufficient time to fulfil his responsibilities as a Non-Executive Director of the Company and does not consider that any other commitment will interfere with his availability to perform his duties as a Non-Executive Director of the Company.

3.5 Directors' Recommendation

The Board (other than Mr McNamara) recommends Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 2 on the basis that Mr McNamara's skills and experience have and will continue to support the Company in achieving its strategic objectives.

4. RESOLUTION 3 – APPROVAL OF 7.1A MANDATE

4.1 General

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of Equity Securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that period.

However, under Listing Rule 7.1A, an eligible entity may seek shareholder approval by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25% (**7.1A Mandate**).

An 'eligible entity' means an entity which is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a market capitalisation of \$300,000,000 or less. The Company is an eligible entity for these purposes.

As at the date of this Notice, the Company is an eligible entity as it is not included in the S&P/ASX 300 Index and has a current market capitalisation of \$7,828,878 (based on the number of Shares on issue and the closing price of Shares on the ASX on 14 October 2022).

Resolution 3 seeks Shareholder approval by way of special resolution for the Company to have the additional 10% placement capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 3 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Equity Securities up to the combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A without any further Shareholder approval.

If Resolution 3 is not passed, the Company will not be able to access the additional 10% capacity to issue Equity Securities without Shareholder approval under Listing

Rule 7.1A, and will remain subject to the 15% limit on issuing Equity Securities without Shareholder approval set out in Listing Rule 7.1.

4.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 7.1A

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.3A, the information below is provided in relation to Resolution 3:

(a) Period for which the 7.1A Mandate is valid

The 7.1A Mandate will commence on the date of the Meeting and expire on the first to occur of the following:

- (i) the date that is 12 months after the date of this Meeting;
- (ii) the time and date of the Company's next annual general meeting; and
- (iii) the time and date of approval by Shareholders of any transaction under Listing Rule 11.1.2 (a significant change in the nature or scale of activities) or Listing Rule 11.2 (disposal of the main undertaking).

(b) Minimum Price

Any Equity Securities issued under the 7.1A Mandate must be in an existing quoted class of Equity Securities and be issued at a minimum price of 75% of the volume weighted average price of Equity Securities in that class, calculated over the 15 trading days on which trades in that class were recorded immediately before:

- (i) the date on which the price at which the Equity Securities are to be issued is agreed by the entity and the recipient of the Equity Securities; or
- (ii) if the Equity Securities are not issued within 10 trading days of the date in Section 2.2(i), the date on which the Equity Securities are issued.

(c) Use of funds raised under the 7.1A Mandate

The Company intends to use funds raised from issues of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate for:

- (i) the acquisition of new resources, assets and investments (including expenses associated with such an acquisition);
- (ii) continued exploration expenditure on the Company's current assets/or projects (funds would then be used for project, feasibility studies and ongoing project administration);
- (iii) the development of the Company's current business; and
- (iv) general working capital.

(d) **Risk of Economic and Voting Dilution**

Any issue of Equity Securities under the 7.1A Mandate will dilute the interests of Shareholders who do not receive any Shares under the issue.

If Resolution 3 is approved by Shareholders and the Company issues the maximum number of Equity Securities available under the 7.1A Mandate, the economic and voting dilution of existing Shares would be as shown in the table below.

The table below shows the dilution of existing Shareholders calculated in accordance with the formula outlined in Listing Rule 7.1A.2, on the basis of the closing market price of Shares and the number of Equity Securities on issue as at 14 October 2022.

- (i) the purpose of the issue;
- (ii) alternative methods for raising funds available to the Company at that time, including, but not limited to, an entitlement issue, share purchase plan, placement or other offer where existing Shareholders may participate;
- (iii) the effect of the issue of the Equity Securities on the control of the Company;
- (iv) the circumstances of the Company, including, but not limited to, the financial position and solvency of the Company;
- (v) prevailing market conditions; and
- (vi) advice from corporate, financial and broking advisers (if applicable).

(f) **Previous approval under Listing Rule 7.1A**

The Company previously obtained approval from its Shareholders pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1A at its annual general meeting held on 12 November 2021 (**Previous Approval**).

During the 12 month period preceding the date of the Meeting, being on and from 25 November 2021, the Company issued 5,519,169 Shares pursuant to the Previous Approval, which represents 10% of the total diluted number of Equity Securities on issue in the Company on 25 November 2021, which was 55,191,688.

Further details of the issues of Equity Securities by the Company pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1A.2 during the 12 month period preceding the date of the Meeting are set out below.

4.3 Voting Exclusion Statement

As at the date of this Notice, the Company is not proposing to make an issue of Equity Securities under Listing Rule 7.1A. Accordingly, a voting exclusion statement is not included in this Notice.

4.4 Directors' Recommendation

The Board recommends Shareholders vote in favour of Resolution 3.

5. RESOLUTION 4 – ADOPTION OF INCENTIVE PERFORMANCE RIGHTS PLAN

5.1 General

Resolution 4 seeks Shareholder approval for the adoption of the employee incentive scheme titled "Incentive Performance Rights Plan" (**Performance Rights Plan**) and for the issue of Performance Rights under the Performance Rights Plan in accordance with Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13(b)).

With effect from 1 October 2022, a new employee share scheme (**ESS**) regime under the Corporations Act (**New Regime**) will be introduced to replace and expand the current level of relief provided by ASIC CO 14/1000 Class Order. The purpose of the New Regime is to make it easier for companies to access regulatory relief from the Corporations Act provisions in respect of licencing, advertising and hawking and the design and distribution obligations with a streamlined set of disclosure requirements applying to the ESS.

The Company adopted its current incentive performance rights plan (**Current Plan**) prior to being admitted to the official list of ASX on 11 May 2021. In light of the changes under the New Regime, the Company proposes to adopt the new Performance Rights Plan to ensure compliance with and to take advantage of the benefits under the New Regime.

The objective of the Performance Rights Plan is to attract, motivate and retain key employees and the Company considers that the adoption of the Performance Rights Plan and the future issue of Performance Rights under the Performance Rights Plan will provide selected employees with the opportunity to participate in the future growth of the Company.

5.2 Listing Rule 7.1 and Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13(b))

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary shares it had on issue at the start of that period.

Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13(b)) provides that Listing Rule 7.1 does not apply to an issue of securities under an employee incentive scheme if, within three years before the date of issue of the securities, the holders of the entity's ordinary securities have approved the issue of equity securities under the scheme as exception to Listing Rule 7.1.

Exception 13(b) is only available if and to the extent that the number of equity securities issued under the scheme does not exceed the maximum number set out in the entity's notice of meeting dispatched to shareholders in respect of the meeting at which shareholder approval was obtained pursuant to Listing Rule 7.2

(Exception 13(b)). Exception 13(b) also ceases to be available if there is a material change to the terms of the scheme from those set out in the notice of meeting.

If Resolution 4 is passed, the Company will be able to issue Performance Rights under the Performance Rights Plan to eligible participants over a period of 3 years. The issue of any Performance Rights to eligible participants under the Performance Rights Plan (up to the maximum number of Performance Rights stated in Section 5.3(c) below) will be excluded from the calculation of the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1.

For the avoidance of doubt, the Company must seek Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 10.14 in respect of any future issues of Performance Rights under the Performance Rights Plan to a related party or a person whose relationship with the company or the related party is, in ASX's opinion, such that approval should be obtained.

If Resolution 4 is not passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of Performance Rights under the Performance Rights Plan to eligible participants, but any issues of Performance Rights will reduce, to that extent, the Company's capacity to issue equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 for the 12 month period following the issue of the Performance Rights.

5.3 Technical information required by Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13)

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.2 (Exception 13), the following information is provided in relation to Resolution 4:

- (a) a summary of the key terms and conditions of the Performance Rights Plan is set out in Schedule 1;
- (b) the Company has not issued any Performance Rights under the Performance Rights Plan as this is the first time that Shareholder approval is being sought for the adoption of the Performance Rights Plan, however, the Company has issued a total of 5,200,000 Performance Rights under the Current Plan since it was first adopted on 11 May 2021; and
- (c) the maximum number of Securities proposed to be issued under the Performance Rights Plan, following Shareholder approval, is 5,964,169 Performance Rights. It is not envisaged that the maximum number of Securities for which approval is sought will be issued immediately.

6. RESOLUTIONS 5 AND 6 – RATIFICATION OF ISSUE OF ACUITY SHARES (ISSUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH ASX LISTING RULE 7.1)

6.1 General

As announced on 6 July 2022, the Company entered into an At-the-Market Subscription Agreement (**ATM Subscription Agreement**) with Investment Management Pty Ltd (as trustee for the Acuity Capital Holdings Trust) (ACN 132 459 093) (**Acuity Capital**). The ATM Subscription Agreement provides the Company with up to \$3,000,000 of standby equity capital over 25 months (**ATM Facility**). The ATM Facility gives the Company significant flexibility of terms and of timing for financing of its exploration activities at its highly prospective copper project portfolio in Chile.

Under the terms of the ATM Subscription Agreement, the Company retains full control of all aspects of the subscription process, having sole discretion including, among other things, whether to utilise the ATM Facility, the maximum number of shares to be issued, the minimum issue price of shares and the timing of each subscription (if any).

There is no obligation for the Company to utilise the ATM Facility and the Company may terminate the ATM Subscription Agreement at any time, without cost or penalty. Acuity Capital and the ATM Subscription Agreement do not place any restrictions at any time on the Company raising capital through other methods. The material terms of the ATM Subscription Agreement are otherwise as follows:

- (a) **term:** 25 months;
- (b) **start date:** 6 July 2022;
- (c) **facility limit:** \$3,000,000;
- (d) **issuance discounts:** 10% for capital totalling \$0 to 10,000,000; 8% for capital totalling between \$10,000,001 and \$15,000,000; 6% for capital totalling between \$15,000,001 and \$20,000,000; and 5% for capital totalling greater than \$20,000,000;
- (e) **security:** 2,800,000 Shares;
- (f) **termination notice:** five business days; and
- (g) **ATM Facility establishment fee:** \$50,000.

When the Company utilises the ATM Subscription Agreement, it is able to set a price floor (at its sole discretion), with the final issue price being calculated as the greater of the nominated floor price and up to a 10% discount to a volume weighted average price over a period of the Company's choosing.

The Company has since issued the following Shares to Acuity from its placement capacity:

- (h) 2,800,000 Shares as security for provision of the ATM Facility on 6 July 2022 (the subject of Resolution 5) (**Acuity Collateral Shares**) under ASX Listing Rule 7.1; and
- (i) 1,650,000 Shares at an issue price of \$0.1667 per Share to raise \$275,055 following utilisation of the ATM Facility for additional working capital on 19 September 2022 (the subject of Resolution 6) (**Acuity Subscription Shares**) under the Previous Approval,

(together, the **Acuity Shares**).

Resolutions 5 and 6 seek Shareholder ratification pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Acuity Shares.

6.2 Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A

Broadly speaking, and subject to a number of exceptions, Listing Rule 7.1 limits the amount of equity securities that a listed company can issue without the approval of its shareholders over any 12 month period to 15% of the fully paid ordinary securities it had on issue at the start of that 12 month period.

Under Listing Rule 7.1A however, an eligible entity can seek approval from its members, by way of a special resolution passed at its annual general meeting, to increase this 15% limit by an extra 10% to 25%.

The issue of the Acuity Shares does not fit within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively used up part of the 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing

Rules 7.1 and 7.1A for the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Acuity Shares.

6.3 Listing Rule 7.4

Listing Rule 7.4 allows the shareholders of a listed company to approve an issue of equity securities after it has been made or agreed to be made. If they do, the issue is taken to have been approved under Listing Rule 7.1 and so does not reduce the company's capacity to issue further equity securities without shareholder approval under that rule.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under Listing Rule 7.1. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Acuity Shares.

Resolutions 5 and 6 seek Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Acuity Shares.

6.4 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolutions 5 and 6 are passed, the Acuity Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of issue of Acuity Shares.

If Resolutions 5 and 6 are not passed, the Acuity Shares will be included in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Acuity Shares.

It is noted that the Company's ability to utilise the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A for issues of equity securities following this Meeting remains conditional on Resolution 3 being passed at this Meeting.

6.5 Technical information required by ASX Listing Rule 7.5

Pursuant to and in accordance with ASX Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to Resolutions 5 and 6:

- (a) the Acuity Shares were issued to Acuity Capital;
- (b) in accordance with paragraph 7.4 of ASX Guidance Note 21, the Company confirms that Acuity Capital was not:
 - (i) a related party of the Company, member of the Company's Key Management Personnel, substantial holders of the Company, advisers of the Company or an associate of any of these parties; and
 - (ii) issued more than 1% of the issued capital of the Company;
- (c) the Acuity Shares were issued on the following basis:
 - (i) 2,800,000 Acuity Collateral Shares were issued pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 (ratification of which is sought under Resolution 5); and

- (ii) 1,650,000 Acuity Subscription Shares issued pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1A (ratification of which is sought under Resolution 6);
- (d) the Acuity Shares issued were all fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company issued on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing Shares;
- (e) the Acuity Shares were issued on the following dates:
 - (i) the Acuity Collateral Shares were issued on 6 July 2022; and
 - (ii) the Acuity Subscription Shares were issued on 19 September 2022;
- (f) the Acuity Collateral Shares were issued for nil cash consideration as security for the provision of the ATM Facility. The Company has not and will not receive any other consideration for the issue of the Acuity Collateral Shares;
- (g) the Acuity Subscription Shares were issued at an issue price of \$0.1667 per Share, which raised \$275,055. The Company has not and will not receive any other consideration for the issue of the Acuity Subscription Shares;
- (h) the Acuity Shares were issued pursuant to the ATM Subscription Agreement, the material terms of which are summarised in Section 6.1;
- (i) the purpose of the issue of the Acuity Collateral Shares was to secure financing of up to \$3,000,000 over 25 months which is intended to be applied towards advancing exploration activities at the Company's copper projects in Chile; and
- (j) the purpose of the issue of the Acuity Subscription Shares was to utilise a portion of the ATM Facility which is intended to be applied towards working capital requirements; and
- (k) a voting exclusion statement has been included for the purpose of Resolutions 5 and 6.

6.6 Board Recommendation

The Board recommends Shareholders vote in favour of Resolutions 5 and 6.

7. BACKGROUND TO RESOLUTIONS 7 – 12 – PLACEMENT AND ENTITLEMENT OFFER

7.1 Placement and Entitlement Offer

On 13 October 2022, the Company announced its intention to undertake a capital raising for the funding of exploration activities at the Company's Lana Corina and Quelon Projects in Chile and for general working capital, comprising:

- (a) a placement of approximately 9,347,917 Shares at an issue price of \$0.12 per share (**Placement Shares**) (pursuant to the Company's Listing Rule 7.1 and 7.1A capacity, ratification of which is sought under Resolutions 7 and 8), with 1 free-attaching Option for every 2 Placement Shares subscribed for, with an exercise price of \$0.18 and an expiry date that is two (2) years from the date of issue (**Placement Options**) to raise approximately \$1,121,750 (before costs) (**Placement**). The issue of the Placement Options to placement subscribers is subject to Shareholder approval sought pursuant to Resolution 9; and

- (b) an entitlement offer of 1 share for every 7 shares held at the record date at an issue price of \$0.12 per Share, together with 1 free-attaching Option for every 2 Shares subscribed for, with an exercise price of \$0.18 and an expiry date that is two (2) years from the date of issue raise up to \$1,022,429 (before costs) (**Entitlement Offer**). Any portion of the Entitlement Offer not taken up will form the shortfall offer (**Shortfall Offer**).

7.2 Lead Manager Fees

The Company engaged Peak Asset Management (**Peak** or **Lead Manager**) as Lead Manager to the Placement and Entitlement Offer. Under the Company's agreement with Peak (**Lead Manager Mandate**), the Company agreed to pay Peak a 1% management fee on all funds raised under the Placement and Entitlement Offer and a 6% capital raise fee on all funds raised (excluding funds raised by Red Cloud, as below) under the Placement and Shortfall Offer.

The Company also agreed, subject to obtaining Shareholder approval sought pursuant to Resolution 10, to issue the Lead Manager (or its nominees) 5,000,000 Options (**Lead Manager Options**). Each Lead Manager Option is exercisable at \$0.18 and has a term of 2 years from the date of issue. The Lead Manager Options may be allocated to other brokers and advisors at Peak's discretion in consultation with the Board of the Company.

7.3 Red Cloud Fees

In addition, the Company engaged Red Cloud Securities Inc. (**Red Cloud**) to act as financial advisor and broker to support its US-based OTC exchange listing. The Company has entered into an agreement with Red Cloud pursuant to which it has agreed to pay Red Cloud a 6% capital raise fee on all funds raised by Red Cloud under the Placement and/or the Shortfall Offer (**Red Cloud Mandate**).

Under the Red Cloud Mandate, the Company has also agreed, subject to Shareholder approval sought pursuant to Resolution 11, to issue to Red Cloud (or its nominees) up to 250,000 Options (**Red Cloud Options**). The Options will be on the same terms as the Lead Manager Options

7.4 Director Shortfall Participation

As set out in the Company's Entitlement Offer Prospectus dated 14 October 2022, Mr Geoffrey McNamara, the Company's Non-Executive Chairman, intends to apply for up to \$32,000 under the Shortfall Offer (comprising 177,778 Shares and 88,889 Options), subject to obtaining Shareholder approval sought pursuant to Resolution 12.

8. RESOLUTIONS 7 AND 8 – RATIFICATION OF ISSUE OF PLACEMENT SHARES

8.1 General

On Thursday, 20 October 2022, the Company issued 9,347,916 Placement Shares pursuant to the Placement as set out in Section 7.1, comprising:

- (a) 5,478,247 Placement Shares issued pursuant to the Company's capacity under Listing Rule 7.1 (being, the subject of Resolution 7); and
- (b) 3,869,169 Placement Shares were issued pursuant to the Company's Previous Approval (being, the subject of Resolution 8).

8.2 Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A

Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A are summarised in Section 6.2.

The issue of the Placement Shares does not fit within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and, as it has not yet been approved by Shareholders, it effectively uses up part of the 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, reducing the Company's capacity to issue further equity securities without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1 and 7.1A for the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Placement Shares.

8.3 Listing Rule 7.4

Listing Rule 7.4 is summarised in Section 6.3.

The Company wishes to retain as much flexibility as possible to issue additional equity securities in the future without having to obtain Shareholder approval for such issues under Listing Rule 7.1. Accordingly, the Company is seeking Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Placement Shares.

Resolutions 7 and 8 seek Shareholder ratification pursuant to Listing Rule 7.4 for the issue of the Placement Shares.

8.4 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolutions 7 and 8 are passed, the Placement Shares will be excluded in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively increasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Placement Shares.

If Resolutions 7 and 8 are not passed, the Placement Shares will be included in calculating the Company's combined 25% limit in Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A, effectively decreasing the number of equity securities the Company can issue without Shareholder approval over the 12 month period following the date of issue of the Placement Shares.

It is noted that the Company's ability to utilise the additional 10% capacity provided for in Listing Rule 7.1A for issues of equity securities following this Meeting remains conditional on Resolution 3 being passed at this Meeting.

8.5 Technical information required by Listing Rule 7.5

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.5, the following information is provided in relation to Resolutions 7 and 8:

- (a) the Placement Shares were issued to professional and sophisticated investors who are clients of Peak and Red Cloud. The recipients were identified through a bookbuild process, which involved Peak and Red Cloud seeking expressions of interest to participate in the capital raising from non-related parties of the Company;
- (b) in accordance with paragraph 7.4 of ASX Guidance Note 21, the Company confirms that none of the recipients were:
 - (i) related parties of the Company, members of the Company's Key Management Personnel, substantial holders of the Company,

advisers of the Company or an associate of any of these parties;
and

- (ii) issued more than 1% of the issued capital of the Company;
- (c) 9,347,917 Placement Shares were issued on the following basis:
 - (i) 5,478,248 Shares issued pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 (ratification of which is sought under Resolution 7); and
 - (ii) 3,869,169 Shares issued pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1A (ratification of which is sought under Resolution 8);
- (d) the Placement Shares issued were all fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company issued on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing Shares;
- (e) the Placement Shares were issued on Thursday, 20 October 2022;
- (f) the issue price was \$0.12 per Placement Shares under both the issue of Shares pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 and Listing Rule 7.1A. The Company has not and will not receive any other consideration for the issue of the Placement Shares;
- (g) the purpose of the issue of the Placement Shares was to raise \$1,121,750, which will be applied towards exploration activities at the Company's Lana Corina and Quelon Projects in Chile and for general working capital; and
- (h) the Placement Shares were issued pursuant to standard subscription agreements entered into by placement participants.

9. RESOLUTIONS 9 TO 11 – APPROVAL OF ISSUE OF PLACEMENT OPTIONS, LEAD MANAGER OPTIONS AND RED CLOUD OPTIONS

As set out in Sections 7.1, 7.2 and 7.3, the Company has agreed to issue:

- (a) 4,673,959 Placement Options, subject to Shareholder approval sought under Resolution 9;
- (b) 5,000,000 Lead Manager Options pursuant to the Lead Manager Mandate, subject to Shareholder approval sought under Resolution 10; and
- (c) up to 250,000 Red Cloud Options pursuant to the Red Cloud Mandate, subject to Shareholder approval sought under Resolution 11.

9.1 Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A

Listing Rules 7.1 and 7.1A are summarised in Section 6.2.

The issue of the Placement Options does not fit within any of the exceptions set out in Listing Rule 7.2 and exceeds the 15% limit in Listing Rule 7.1. The issue of the Placement Options therefore requires the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.1.

The proposed issue of the Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options falls within exception 17 of Listing Rule 7.2. It therefore requires the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 7.1.

9.2 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolutions 9 to 11 are passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of the Placement Options, Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options. In addition, the issue of the Placement Options, Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options will be excluded from the calculation of the number of equity securities that the Company can issue without Shareholder approval under Listing Rule 7.1.

If Resolutions 9 to 11 are not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the Placement Options, Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options and would be required to remunerate Peak and Red Cloud via alternative means.

Resolutions 9 to 11 seek Shareholder approval for the purposes of Listing Rule 7.1 for the issue of the Placement Options, Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options.

9.3 Technical information required by Listing Rule 7.1

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 7.3, the following information is provided in relation to Resolutions 9 to 11:

- (a) the Options will be issued as follows:
 - (i) the Placement Options will be issued to subscribers of the Placement;
 - (ii) the Lead Manager Options will be issued to Peak (or their nominee(s)); and
 - (iii) the Red Cloud Options will be issued to Red Cloud (or their nominee(s));
- (b) in accordance with paragraph 7.2 of ASX Guidance Note 21, the Company confirms that none of the recipients will be:
 - (i) related parties of the Company, members of the Company's Key Management Personnel, substantial holders of the Company, advisers of the Company or an associate of any of these parties; and
 - (ii) issued more than 1% of the issued capital of the Company;
- (c) the maximum number of:
 - (i) Placement Options to be issued is 4,673,959;
 - (ii) Lead Manager Options to be issued is 5,000,000; and
 - (iii) Red Cloud Options to be issued is 250,000.

The terms and conditions of the Placement Options, Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options are set out in Schedule 2;

- (d) the Placement Options, Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options will be issued no later than 3 months after the date of the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the Listing Rules) and it is intended that issue of the Placement Options, Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options will occur on the same date;

- (e) the Placement Options will be issued at a nil issue price, free-attaching to the Placement Shares;
- (f) the Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options will be issued at a nil issue price, in consideration for services provided by Peak and Red Cloud;
- (g) the purpose of the issue of the Placement Options is to incentivise investors to subscribe for Placement Shares;
- (h) the purpose of the issue of the Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options is to satisfy the Company's obligations under the Lead Manager Mandate and Red Cloud Mandate respectively;
- (i) the Placement Options are being issued under standard subscription agreements to Placement subscribers;
- (j) the Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options are being issued to Peak and Red Cloud under the Lead Manager Mandate and Red Cloud Mandate respectively. A summary of the material terms of the Lead Manager Mandate is set out in Section 7.2. A summary of the material terms of the Red Cloud Mandate is set out in Section 7.3; and
- (k) the Placement Options, Lead Manager Options and Red Cloud Options are not being issued under, or to fund, a reverse takeover.

10. RESOLUTION 12 – APPROVAL FOR DIRECTOR TO PARTICIPATE IN SHORTFALL – GEOFFREY MCNAMARA

10.1 General

As set out in Section 7.4, Mr Geoffrey McNamara, Non-Executive Chairman of the Company, wishes to participate in the Shortfall Offer.

The Shortfall Offer is a separate offer made pursuant to the Entitlement Offer prospectus and will remain open for up to three months following the closing date of the Entitlement Offer.

The issue price of Shares to be issued under the Shortfall Offer is \$0.12 (**Shortfall Shares**), being the price at which Shares were offered under the Placement and Entitlement Offer. The Directors reserve the right to issue Shortfall Shares at their absolute discretion.

Mr Geoffrey McNamara wishes to participate in the Shortfall Offer on the same terms as unrelated parties who wish to participate in the Shortfall Offer, for up to \$32,000 (comprising 177,778 Shares and 88,889 Options) (**Shortfall Securities**) (**Participation**).

Accordingly, Resolution 12 seeks Shareholder approval to issue the Shortfall Securities to Mr McNamara (or his nominee), as a result of the Participation on the terms set out below.

10.2 Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act

For a public company, or an entity that the public company controls, to give a financial benefit to a related party of the public company, the public company or entity must:

- (a) obtain the approval of the public company's members in the manner set out in sections 217 to 227 of the Corporations Act; and

(b) give the benefit within 15 months following such approval,

unless the giving of the financial benefit falls within an exception set out in sections 210 to 216 of the Corporations Act.

The Participation will result in the issue of Shortfall Securities which constitutes giving a financial benefit and Mr McNamara, is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director.

The Directors (other than Mr McNamara who has a material personal interest in the Resolution) consider that Shareholder approval pursuant to Chapter 2E of the Corporations Act is not required in respect of the Participation because the Shares will be issued to Mr McNamara (or his nominee) on the same terms as Shares issued to non-related party participants in the Capital Raising and as such the giving of the financial benefit is on arm's length terms.

10.3 Listing Rule 10.11

Listing Rule 10.11 provides that unless one of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12 applies, a listed company must not issue or agree to issue equity securities to:

- 10.11.1 a related party;
- 10.11.2 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (30%+) holder in the company;
- 10.11.3 a person who is, or was at any time in the 6 months before the issue or agreement, a substantial (10%+) holder in the company and who has nominated a director to the board of the company pursuant to a relevant agreement which gives them a right or expectation to do so;
- 10.11.4 an associate of a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.3; or
- 10.11.5 a person whose relationship with the company or a person referred to in Listing Rules 10.11.1 to 10.11.4 is such that, in ASX's opinion, the issue or agreement should be approved by its shareholders,

unless it obtains the approval of its shareholders.

The Participation falls within Listing Rule 10.11.1 and does not fall within any of the exceptions in Listing Rule 10.12. It therefore requires the approval of Shareholders under Listing Rule 10.11.

Resolution 12 seeks Shareholder approval for the Participation under and for the purposes of Listing Rule 10.11.

10.4 Technical information required by Listing Rule 14.1A

If Resolution 12 is passed, the Company will be able to proceed with the issue of the Shares under the Participation within one month after the date of the Meeting (or such later date as permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the Listing Rules) and will raise additional funds which will be used in the manner set out in Section 7.1 above. As approval pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 is not required for the issue of the Shares in respect of the Participation (because approval is being obtained under Listing Rule 10.11), the issue of the Shares will not use up any of the Company's 15% annual placement capacity.

If Resolution 12 is not passed, the Company will not be able to proceed with the issue of the Shares under the Participation and no further funds will be raised in respect of the Capital Raising.

10.5 Technical Information required by Listing Rule 10.13

Pursuant to and in accordance with Listing Rule 10.13, the following information is provided in relation to Resolution 12:

- (a) the Shares will be issued to Mr McNamara (or his nominee), who falls within the category set out in Listing Rule 10.11.1, as Mr McNamara is a related party of the Company by virtue of being a Director;
- (b) the maximum number of Shortfall Securities to be issued to Mr McNamara (or his nominee) is 177,778 Shares and 88,889 Options, as the Options will be issued free attaching with the Shares on a 1 for 2 basis;
- (c) the Shares issued will be fully paid ordinary shares in the capital of the Company issued on the same terms and conditions as the Company's existing Shares;
- (d) the Options will be issued on the terms and conditions set out in Schedule 2;
- (e) the Shortfall Securities will be issued no later than 3 month after the date of the Meeting (or such later date to the extent permitted by any ASX waiver or modification of the Listing Rules) and it is anticipated the Shortfall Securities will be issued on the same date;
- (f) the issue price will be \$0.12 per Share and nil per Option, being the same terms as the Shares and Options issued to other participants in the Entitlement Offer. The Company will not receive any other consideration for the issue of the Shortfall Securities (other than in respect of funds received on exercise of the Options);
- (g) the purpose of the issue of Shortfall Securities under the Participation is to raise capital, which the Company intends to use in the manner set out in Section 7.1 above;
- (h) the Shortfall Securities to be issued under the Participation are not intended to remunerate or incentivise the Director;
- (i) the Shortfall Securities are not being issued under an agreement; and
- (j) a voting exclusion statements is included in Resolution 12 of the Notice.
